



PRIVATE PHOTOGRAPHERS, FILM OR VIDEO FILM OPERATORS AT DFS CRUFTS 2010

1. Thank you for your application to film/photograph at DFS Crufts for private purposes. A permit is not required but those who take films and photographs at the show are asked to comply with the following conditions and additionally to observe the Crufts Regulation on photography as set out at the foot of this notice.

2. **Use and Purpose of the Photographs**
 - a) The film/photographs should not be used for any commercial purpose.
 - b) The film/photographs should not be distributed for showing on television transmissions at the time of the event nor subsequently in any way whatsoever.
 - c) No film/photographs to be taken or published which shall contain anything obscene or libellous or defamatory or infringe any Intellectual Property Right or any right whatever of any person (including the Kennel Club); or which may be to the detriment of the dogs taking part in the Event, the Kennel Club or any Visitors; or which may be prejudicial to the good image of the Kennel Club or which would if made public lead to adverse publicity for the Kennel Club or cause damage to the Kennel Club or bring the reputation of the Kennel Club or its members and/or Visitors into question;
 - d) Taking photographs or filming in the Exhibition premises for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. The Organisers reserve the right at their absolute discretion to confiscate cameras and/or films for infringement of this condition.
 - e) The Kennel Club will not charge a fee for private filming or photographing at DFS Crufts, in accordance with the above conditions, but in return for this facility reserves the right to borrow the film/photographs for viewing and, if appropriate, reproductions.

3 Requirements at the venue

- a) Not to block gangways – cameras and equipment must be HAND HELD.
- b) Not to enter a breed ring during any part of the judging or interfere in any way with the judging of the dogs or the running of the Show. However Judges may be asked for permission for photographs to be taken at the end of the class or after the Challenge Certificate is awarded.
- c) Not to film/photograph any specific dog without the consent of the exhibitor and to inform the exhibitor of the intended usage of such photographs and where the photographs may be published eg specific websites and so on.
- d) Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the rings at all times unless the operation of the camera is actually affecting exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or it is clear that exhibits are being affected, a ring steward or the Judge is empowered to stop the person concerned.
- e) NO ADDITIONAL LIGHTING TO THAT EXISTING IN THE HALL CAN BE PERMITTED
- f) AT ALL TIMES COMPLY WITH ANY INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN BY THE RING STEWARDS OR THE MAIN RING STEWARDS.

Crufts Regulation; Photography and Video Rights:

The taking of photographs or video footage in the exhibition premises for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. Press accredited photographers are provided with permission to take photographs ONLY for use in newspapers, magazines and internet sites – this is for news purposes only. The Organisers reserve the right at their absolute discretion to confiscate cameras and/or films for infringement of this condition. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs or video film of general views of the Show, provided that these are for private use. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor. No photography or filming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place. However, judges may allow it to happen at the end of classes or after the Challenge Certificate is awarded. Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the rings at all times unless the operation of the camera is actually affecting exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or it is clear that exhibits are being affected, a ring steward or the judge is empowered to stop the person concerned. Cinematograph or television equipment may only be used at the Show if a permit has been issued by the Organisers. There are also certain restrictions on the use of cameras for still photography and private video films. Full details of these and filming permits may be obtained from the Press Office, The Kennel Club, 1-5 Clarges Street, Piccadilly, London W1J 8AB.
